# INCORPORATING OHS INTO THE DESIGN OF WORKPLACES AND PROCESSES PROGRAM by FRANK RENSHAW\*

\*From the time we first learned the fundamentals of industrial hygiene, the importance of "designing in" safeguards to prevent occupational illnesses, injuries, and fatalities has been embraced as a concept and recognized as an imperative for success as a profession. But the "how to" and benefits of *incorporating OHS into the design of workplaces and processes* have all too often eluded us, leaving employers and employees with a legacy of retrofits and a burden of "live-with-it" conditions which under serve the men and women we are charged with protecting on the job. Please see the attached preliminary program for the schedule of distinguished speakers and the title of their presentation.

The 2018 annual meeting technical event on Thursday afternoon will be a guided tour of the Scripps Institute of Oceanography's (SIO) Birch Aquarium in La Jolla and the Scripps Pier, Experimental Aquarium, and Research Space. SIO is a department of UC San Diego, and is one of the oldest, largest, and most important centers for ocean, earth and atmospheric science research, education and public service in the world. The calculated cost, including transportation, is \$50.00 per person. This information is on the back of the meeting registration form, please add this amount to your registration fee when you send your check.\*

As detailed in the previous membership newsletter, the 2018 annual meeting will be held at The Bay Club Hotel and Marina, 2131 Shelter Island Drive, San Diego, CA 92106. A contract was signed and a block of twenty (20) rooms secured - the required deposit of \$1,500.00 was made. The meeting will be held **Wednesday**, **January 17 through Friday**, **January 19, 2018** (i.e., the week of the Martin Luther King holiday).

Daily room rates negotiated for single or double are:

- \$139.00 plus 12.5% occupancy tax (\$17.38) = \$156.38 per night. The group rate will be honored for three days pre and three days post conference stays.
- Other available rates \$149.00 triple, \$159.00 quad, \$239.00 suite plus the 12.5% occupancy tax.
- Complimentary Parking
- Breaks, lunch for Thursday and Friday, and the banquet are discussed later in this newsletter.

- All rooms offer coffee makers, hair dryers, iron/ironing board, mini safes, etc.
- Complimentary Wi-Fi throughout the hotel
- Access to Pool, Jacuzzi and Fitness Center
- Hospitality suite complimentary three nights, and \$139.00 plus 12.5% occupancy tax for extra night

- USA Today and complimentary coffee served in the lobby.
- Members voted to return to this hotel at the business meeting in 2017. The Bay Club hotel staff is very attentive to our needs and this contributes greatly in making our annual meetings both successful and memorable.

Whichever number you use you must identify yourself as part of the YPSW-AIHA group attending the Jan 17-19, 2018 meeting to receive the special negotiated rate and have the reservation counted in the YPSW-AIHA room block. Remember, the hotel will also accept pre and post extensions of stay at the group rate in a limited capacity; check on availability when making your hotel reservations. An advance deposit or credit card guarantee for the first night's room and tax is required for our "group negotiated" rates by December 27, 2017; after that date rooms will be on a space and rate availability basis. NOTE: Check in time is 4:00 PM, if rooms are ready earlier, you will be accommodated. Early check in and late check out are provided on availability and arrangements must be made with the front desk - some charges may apply.

## **MEAL INFORMATION**

Breakfast will be on your own each day – it is NOT included in the room rate or meeting registration. The hotel offers a variety of great selections to start your day.

Breaks will be available in the conference room; mornings - coffee and assorted teas; afternoons - cookies and soft drinks.

Lunch on Thursday will be the Bay Club Buffet: Caesar Salad; Sliced Roast Beef with Peppercorn Sauce; Salmon wit Creamy Dill Sauce; Steamed Seasonal Vegetables; Oven Roasted Potatoes; Wild Rice; Rolls and Butter; Coffee, Iced Tea; Chocolate Cake.

## **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE NOTES**

The Executive Committee met via teleconferences (Jul 28 and Nov 3, 2017): significant items discussed were:

- As of Nov 3, the YPSW treasury has a total of \$16,009 (\$1,953 in checking and \$14,056 in savings).
- Terry Thedell has been updating the AIHA Wikepedia page.

- In Jan 2018 Terry Thedell and the Secretary-Treasurer will visit the Bank of America in San Diego to add Terry as a signatory on the YPSW account.
- President Lieckfield submitted the YPSW Synergist article on the 2017 meeting to the AIHA editor.
- President Lieckfield submitted Charlie Blake's Fellow nomination for approval.
- Denise Daggett distributed a call to members reiterating the importance of YPSW members participating in the AIHA National Challenge Initiative.
- Tom Slavin attended the AIHA Local Sections Council held during the AIHce.
- The 2018 Clayton Award recipient is Eula Bingham; she was very appreciative of the honor.
- Two Executive Committee positions to be filled in 2018: The Executive Committee unanimously nominated Barbara Dawson for President-Elect 2018 and Frank Hearl for a three year (2018-2021) Director position. Additional nominations will be accepted from the floor. Election will take place during the Business Meeting, January 17, 2018.
- Registration fees were approved as follows: \$245 Full three days; \$110 Thursday only; \$155 Friday only; \$80 Banquet only; (a reminder about fees they are calculated primarily on our costs for food.) \$50 Scripps Tour is a separate item from registration fees. All fees include our well stocked hospitality suite Tuesday thru Friday nights open Tuesday to accommodate early arrivals.
- President-Elect and Program Chair Frank Renshaw kept the committee informed on the progress of his program; locating and persuading an outstanding slate of speakers to participate. The Preliminary Program is included with this mailing.
- Two applicants were approved for membership (more information later in this letter).
- Administrative Policy Statements developed and approved: (1) YPSW Annual Meeting Speaker Registration Fees; (2) Inactivation of Nonresponsive Lifetime Members; and (3) Inviting Program Speakers to YPSW Membership. This internal information will be posted on our website.
