






U.S. credentialing bodies are **prohibited** from manipulating the supply of practitioners in the marketplace or making decisions for economic or political purposes.



Top 10 Countries with CIHs in 2019







Retirement Status




- The BGC Board approved the creation of a designation for CIHs and QEPs who are at the end of their careers.
- The <u>designation cannot be used in place of a CIH or QEP</u> credential for work. However, it will provide an opportunity to acknowledge the contribution of CIH or QEP in good standing toward the protection of the public and the environment, and will allow for on-going engagement with the professional community.
- BGC is working with the software developer to modify CAPS.
 An email will be sent in the coming weeks, once final details are complete.
